This admission offer and the PGS award are independent of the outcome of your application for the Hong Kong PhD Fellowship (HKPFS). However, if you are selected by the Hong Kong Research Grants Council for the HKPFS award, you will receive the HKPFS in place of the above mentioned PGS award. HKPFS awardees will also be governed by the same Terms and Conditions as the PGS awardees.

Note: The normative period of study for completing a PhD degree in full-time mode is 4 years. It is reduced to 3 years if a relevant research postgraduate degree is earned prior to entering the PhD program.

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To meet our admission requirement for the degree requirement, you will be required by the Department, to take and pass with a grade of no less than B for the following additional undergraduate courses in the first year of your studies:

Operating Systems	(COMP 3511)
Design and Analysis of Algorithms	(COMP 3711)
Theory of Computation	(COMP 3721)

If you fail to attain a grade of at least B in any of above courses, you will be required to withdraw from the Doctor of Philosophy program. If you feel that you have already met the above requirement based on your previous studies, please produce appropriate documentation (i.e., course descriptions and examples of course work such as assignments and exams) on your arrival in the Department and your case will be reviewed by the Postgraduate Studies Committee. Meanwhile, your enrollment status will be *provisional* until the above requirement is satisfied.
